

ABATE of Northern Nevada Questionnaire for Those Seeking Public Office

1. What is your motivation for seeking public office?

I have been a public school teacher for the past four years and I have lived in Nevada for 31 years. My students are my motivation for seeking to become governor of our Great State of Nevada. 2. What are your views on the role of Government? What should be the role of Federal Government? What should be the role of State Government?

I believe government should protect the rights of its citizens and create an economy that fosters free enterprise. The Federal Government should protect our country from enemies of the state and create a free enterprise economy. The Federal Government should respect state's rights and not infringe on a states authority in running itself or governing its residents.

3. Legislation that infringes on our people's rights and provides no benefit economically or socially to the people of our state will be vetoed. 8. What are your views on the “right to repair” act (H.R. 2057) proposed by Congress?

I believe that the “right to repair” act (H.R. 2057) is an act that shows some promise with regards to allowing consumers to repair their own vehicles. This could pose some problems though for the lay person with regards to fixing their car. However, they could take the information from the manufacturer on how to diagnose their problems given to them by the manufacturer under this act and have the car repair place fix the car with the given information. I approve of this act.
