Questionnaire for Those Seeking Public Office

1. What is your motivation for seeking public office?

I, Jesse Holland, am a NonPartisan Candidate representing Nevada for United States Senate without party ties. My affiliation is with the people, for the people and by the people.

Although most of us are old enough to remember vaguely what our representative's functions are, we have growing numbers of people who no longer understand and/or don't care. 7. Would you be willing to help a pro choice helmet bill to the governor's desk for passage?
